Barbourne, Worcestershire

1 Cherry Burst 4% Cider

A dry cider flavoured with the juice of cherries making it medium sweet.

Hallow, Worcestershire

2 21 Medium 7.5%

Celebrating 21 years of cider making at Greenstreet Farm, Hallow Worcs. Full of flavour, 2018 vintage, clear and bright,

3 21 Sweet 7.2%

From a restored traditional orchard near Worcester. Will suit those who like a strong sweet cider.

4 Victorian Orchard Perry 6.1%

Made from trees planted in 1850 the traditional way in Worcestershire, clear and tasty.

Bodenham, Herefordshire

5 Perry 6.1% Medium Dry

Perry made from local grown pears.

6 Cider 6% Dry Cider

Made from a variety of apples.

Gwatkins

Abbey Dore, Herefordshire

7 Pyder 5% Medium

An Original Pear Cider made from a blend of the best apples and pears grown in the county of Herefordshire.

8 Stoke Red 6.5% Sweet Cider

Single variety cider made from Stoke apples to produce a delightful sweet cider.

9 Oldfields 7.5% Medium Perry

Oldfields pear is the queen of all the perry pear varieties.

10 Silly Ewe 4.5% Dry Cider

A very light brown in colour with oak and apples in the aroma.

11 Rum Barrel 7.5% Cider

Rum barrels are filled with freshly-pressed apple juice to create a special full-bodied tippie combining the taste of sweet apple cider and dark spirit rum. Slightly hazy.

12 Barb Wire Rhubarb 4% Cider

Cider flavoured with the juice made from rhubarb grown on the farm.

Long Mynd Cider

Bishops Castle, Shropshire

13 Medium, 6.5% Cider

Fermented in Scotch whisky barrels to create a unique flavour and taste.

14 Dry, 6.5% Cider

It's a refreshing drink that smells and tastes of ripe autumn apples from traditional English orchards.

Newton Court

Leominster, Herefordshire

15 First Press 5.8% Medium Cider

A blend of eating apples including Newtons Wonder, Coxes Orange Pippin and Worcester Pearmain. That makes for a cider that's fruity, bold and very easy drinking.

16 Panting Partridge 5.3% Medium Perry

Made with Perry pears hand picked in orchards from Yarkhill to Much Marcle. Medium with a juicy pear taste and delicate wine finish.

17 Browns 6.8% Cider

Made from a single variety of Browns apple sharp and sweet.

18 Gasping Goose 5.8% Certified Organic Medium Cider

A complex medium cider with a slightly tannic finish.

Cider and Perry

This short and easy to understand new definition was developed by CAMRA in order to make it easier to identify which are real ciders and perry:

- **CAMRA defines real Cider or Perry as being fermented from the whole juice of fresh pressed apples or pears, without the use of concentrated or chaptalised juices**

Within this, a number of real ciders and perries can be additionally described as 'live'.

Why does CAMRA have a definition?

In 1985 CAMRA recognised that cider and perry as traditional drinks were under threat and committed to campaigning in support of them. Unless you lived in an area which had a tradition of cider production it was highly unlikely that you would be able to buy cider or perry. Perry in particular was in real danger of dying out. Had it not begun to feature at CAMRA festivals perry might well have disappeared altogether.

The Campaign began to inform consumer choice, to encourage producers to continue making cider and perry, and to raise consumer awareness at festivals.

In support of these efforts CAMRA coined the term 'real cider' to describe ciders and perry created using traditional ingredients and processes.

The world of cider has evolved so much in the 40 years since CAMRA began to campaign for real cider and perry that it is virtually unrecognisable. The Campaign has therefore sought to clarify a definition of 'real cider and perry' that is easy to follow and can inform the consumer and champion producers.
